Masters of 200 Chisels and Carving Knives

Inami's woodcarving originated at Zuisenji Temple (Inami branch) constructed in the 14th century. After its main hall burned down in mid-18th century, the technique of imperial woodcarvers, called in from Kyoto for its reconstruction, was passed down and flourished as Inami Woodcarving. From ranma (decorative transom pieces), tsuitate (movable screens), to small interior items, Inami's woodcarvers excel as masters of more than 200 chisels and carving knives.
